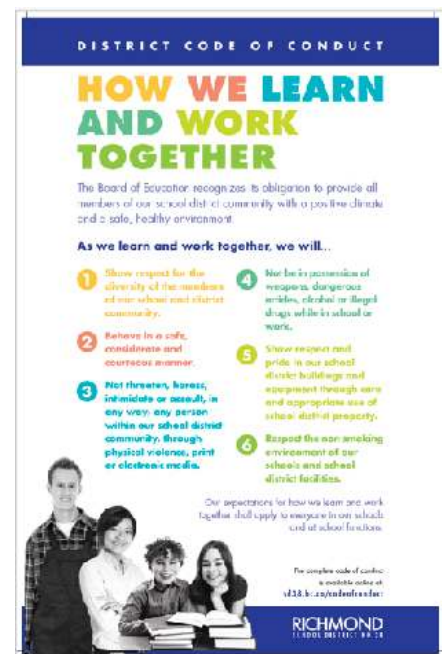
Window Into Learning
