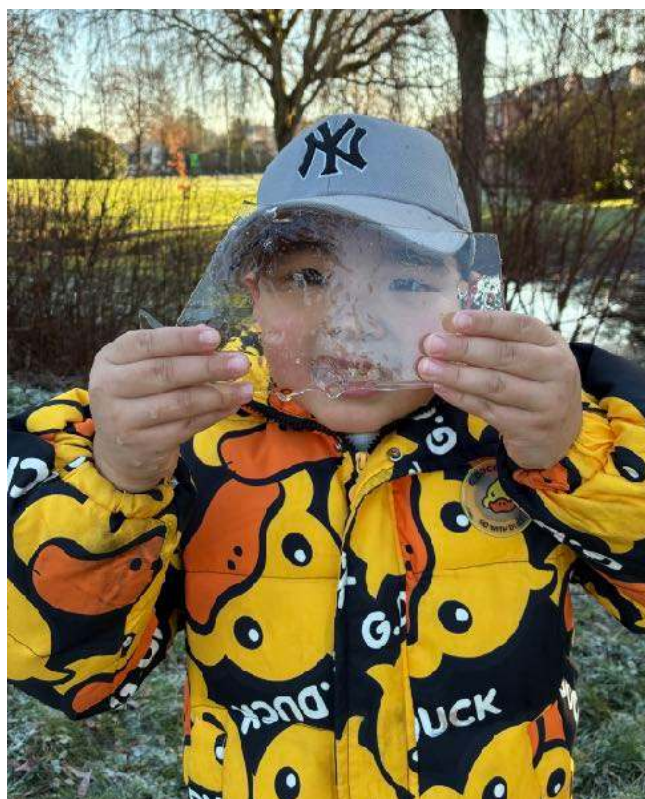

Dear Griffin Families,

It is hard to believe that we are at the start of February already, but here we are!

The weather may not be quite as wintery as some of us might like these days, but it is definitely wet enough. Teachers are continuing to have conversations with their classes and individual students about how to manage themselves better on the rainy/muddy days. As you can imagine it takes a lot of time and energy to deal with the boots, jackets and changes of clothing in the earlier primary classes. In some cases children are forgetting that they have to continue learning through the day, that they can't go home and have a bath. In our upper intermediate grades the challenges are often a lack of preparation for weather. I would encourage families to think about sending an umbrella with their older child who might not be willing to wear the rain coat or boots. The students need the fresh air and nature and we need them comfortable to keep learning through the day. Thank you!!

This week we had another great basketball game with the students at Quilchena. Our Grade 6/7s continue to represent the school very well, showing good sporting spirit and playing as a team. A good measure of the teamwork is the number of players that have been scoring baskets. We are working on the idea that everyone will score a basket sometime in the season. They can do it!

On Thursday next week we will be undertaking a "Hold and Secure" practice. In this practice we will be trying a reverse evacuation to simulate a situation where we need to quickly call the students in from the playground. Teachers will be reminding students that 3 warning bells a the signal to re-enter the school immediately and go to their classroom. It is part of our annual emergency response program to practice these types of scenarios. This will not be a surprise experience this time, but through the Spring we will be conducting emergency practices that are unannounced to test our response skills.
