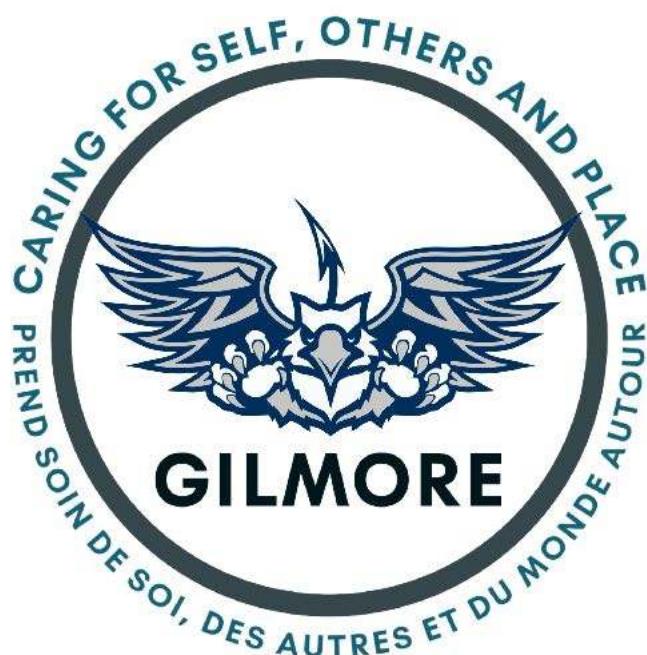

We completed a very important Emergency Drill yesterday morning. We undertook a “Reverse Evacuation” and a Hold and Secure practice. The purpose of the drill was to experience what it would be like if ever we had an emergency during a play time that required students to re-enter the building and get to their classrooms quickly and safely. There could be many reasons that this might be necessary. The students did an excellent job of responding to the 3 Bell Alarm. Please take a few minutes to chat with your child about their experience.

In a few weeks time we will be hosting the second round of Learning Update Conversations with families. Please make sure that you are watching for an invitation from your child’s teacher and make the necessary arrangements to attend. These conversations are strategically placed around the mid point of the year as there will be lots of learning to celebrate and plenty of time to work on whatever the next learning goals will be.

I want to bring the following to your attention and ask for your help. We are noticing an unfortunate pattern in the student washrooms these days and would appreciate family’s support.
